Introduction

Originally published in 1997 by James Bendon Ltd in Cyprus it is now nearly 20 years since I wrote *Robertson Revisited*. In 2012 the first supplement was published by the TPO & Seapost Society, both on their website and as hard copy. Even now I am still receiving new bits of information from all over the world, including totally new markings, and the time now seems ripe to put these together in the form of a Second Supplement to the original book. This includes all the information in the First Supplement of 2012. Cavendish Philatelic Auctions published the third edition of Roger Hosking's *Paquebot Cancellations of the World* in 2000, and I am most grateful to both publisher and author for permission to use this mine of information to make the record as complete as possible. Readers will see how much this has added by the frequent references to "Hosking 3" throughout.

Since then Mike Dovey and Keith Morris have produced their splendid *Paquebot Cancellations of the World and more...*, with the blessing of Roger Hosking. This is both an update to Hosking 3 and, excitingly, contains a wealth of information on topics such as: manuscript PAQUEBOT markings; European, Italian, Japanese and US Sea Post Offices; the New Zealand Marine Post Offices; Floating Post Offices; Ship-related marks of South Africa, Australia, Dockside markings; Special Event markings; Ocean Post Offices and a host of other markings with maritime connections. Much of the "and more..." section has been recorded elsewhere, and is duly acknowledged as such, but to access all this information the collector would need a largish library and many published articles. The book is an invaluable reference and is highly recommended to all those interested in maritime postal history. I am most grateful to the authors for permission to reproduce their markings and data on new discoveries. I would further like to thank Mike Dovey for kindly perusing the first draft and making a number of helpful suggestions, which has helped make the Supplement that much better than it otherwise would have been.

I am also most grateful to all my worldwide circle of philatelic friends for their help, which has been acknowledged in the remarks as far as possible, and sincerely apologise for any inadvertent omissions.

Finally, my thanks to my old friend Julian Jones, webmaster of the TPO & Seapost Society, firstly for persuading the Committee to host the Supplement, and secondly for putting it on line, thus allowing any interested collectors to access the new data.

Additions or Corrections

If anyone has anything new to report, be it a new colour, extended dates, or a new marking, I would welcome their input, which should include a good quality jpeg image of the cover (at 300 dots per inch please) and the measurements in mm of a rectangle just touching the outer extremities of the marking. Please note I am not interested in tiny variations of a mm or two in size, which are usually explained by how heavily the marking is struck or other factors such as paper shrinkage, and in any case the differences are usually impossible to allocate accurately on anything other than ***** specimens of the marking. Notes

- 1. New markings in Hosking's third edition are annotated "Hosking 3".
- 2. Markings and date extensions recorded by Mike Dovey and Keith Morris additional to Hosking 3 are annotated "Dovey & Morris".
- 3. Markings reported other than these 2 sources are annotated with the name of the correspondent informing me of their existence.
- 4. The sizes, where given, for new markings are either the outer diameter for circular markings, or the dimensions of a rectangle that just touches the extremities of the marking, as far as I can tell from the best copy available.
- 5. New drawings are taken either from published works as acknowledged, or from actual examples on cover, touched up to remove as far as possible distracting manuscript markings that affect the handstamp, and enhanced to show as best I can what the complete marking should look like after inking in the faint or missing letters. The overall size is correct; the exact positioning of some of the missing letters may not be



PPWSL1

A hitherto unrecorded marking on letter to Pictou, reported by Malcolm Montgomery. Dated 22 August 1815, this was after the PPWSL scheme had ended on 11 July 1815. The letter is, however, rated under the new scheme for outward ship letters, namely half the packet letter postage, rather than the one third rate under the PPWSL scheme. Presumably Aberdeen had no available Ship Letter handstamp available so used the old PPWSL type.







N1. This Foreign Section Birmingham marking is known used on naval mail between 1908 and 1913, and almost certainly earlier and later dates. It was also probably used on mail other than naval. An unframed version is also known (N1a), used in 1914, on a letter to HMS *Good Hope*, lost with all hands at the Battle of Coronel. See Hoggarth & Gwynn's *Maritime Disaster Mail*, page 158. This cover is now in the collection of Tony Walker and is reproduced below by kind permission.



Note 1. Brian Purcell says that all the S4 markings are smudged on the last figure of the mileage and suggests that the figure is actually 122.

Note 2. John Dickson points out that for Note 6 at the top of page 43 of the original book: the first line should read "The "Cape Packet Bristol" handstamp was used on mails landed at <u>Dartmouth</u> by the Lindsay Line." Further on in that Note the ship *Tynemouth* arrived at Falmouth, not Dartmouth, and *Scotland* arrived at Dartmouth on 20 June, not 24 June.

Note 3. 3 examples only seen to date. The 1975 cover was from the aircraft carrier HMS *Hermes*. Her mails must have been landed by tender – she was far too big to have entered Bristol docks. Mike Dovey reports the third example dated 21 March 1988.

Note 4. Martin Evans reports a parcel post piece from Bristol dated 18 Sep 1914 addressed to HMS *Hogue* with a rectangular marking 50 x 19 mm reading: " $Vaisseau\ Perdu$ / Ship Lost", too poor to reproduce. *Hogue* was sunk by U-9 on 22 Sep 1914, so this may well be a London marking struck when the item was returned to sender.

Note 1. The In2 marking and the London receiving datestamp are both struck in identical shades of vermillion red, strongly suggesting the India h/s was also applied in London. Another cover in the Loraine collection by the same voyage has In1 struck in black ink. Loraine suggests this latter cover was in loose mails, so stamped on arrival at Dartmouth, whereas the cover showing the red IN2 was in closed mails for London, so struck on arrival there. This seems highly likely.





Apart from minor size variations and slightly heavier or lighter lettering, they are variations too minor to list in my opinion. Flyspeckers can have fun with Hosking 3 pages 4 and 5 or Dovey & Morris pages 2 to 4 and 274.

Note 1. M1 and M2 are thought to be Dublin markings, but may well be of Cork, for which a 1d stamp as M2 is known in 1862. They are to be seen occasionally on unprepaid transatlantic mails, with M1 considerably scarcer than M2, though neither are common. The date spread is wider than indicated – I just did not record these markings to begin with.

Note 2. This rate marking was originally entered in *Robertson Revisited* as Liverpool type M73, but with the proviso that it could have been an on-board sorting handstamp. It has now been seen on 1864 cover to Dublin, so unless Liverpool and Dublin were both issued with near identical handstamps (always a possibility) it seems that on-board sorting is probably correct. Examples are very scarce.



Martin Hosselmann reports the letter shown above, sent from Calcutta, backstamped at Liverpool on 26 and Edinburgh 27 August 1837. If this is a Dublin marking it is a pretty unique item. One wonders if it was "manufactured" at Liverpool by blanking out the second line of one of the Liverpool India markings. If so it is still a very unusual cover.


- but three examples are known dated 13 July 1941, rather late for a fully named stamp. All three of these covers have Army type censor markings.
- **Note 4**. The cover has a Liverpool Dead Letter Office date stamp for 11 March 1942. The wreck has not been identified as yet. The marking measures 64x5 mm.
- Note 5. M16 has now been seen in red, pink, purple, and black inks.
- **Note 6**. The makeshift nature of this stamp is clear from the ragged alignment of the letters. Used on mail ex ss *Commodore*, sunk in the Mediterranean 2 Dec 1915 by German submarine, rescued mail being brought to Liverpool for treatment in Feb 1916.
- **Note 7.** M18a, 23 mm diameter, is similar to M18, but with wording LIVERPOOL/LANDING STAGE rather than LANDING STAGE/LIVERPOOL. Three examples seen on adhesive only, dated 17 Aug 1878 to 25 Sep 1880.
- **Note 8**. The large 21 CENTS marking reported measures 21x21 mm and was found on cover from South Shields to Philadelphia with Liverpool transit date stamp for 10 Mar 1857 and accompanying lozenge type M27. It is most unlikely to have been sent via London and is considered a genuine Liverpool marking, albeit not seen in the (incomplete) steel impressions books.
- Note 9. See Note 2 for Dublin. Probably an onboard sorting marking.
- **Note 10.** Reported by Richard F Winter. The marking is on cover forwarded from Liverpool to the USA by the Collins liner *Arctic* in January 1853. There are no handstamps on return of the letter to the UK. The marking is significantly smaller than the similar Figure C2 of London and is considered to be most probably a Liverpool marking.
- Note 11. M25 has been seen without code letter at the foot, dated 18 Oct 43, reported by Steve Ellis.

- Note 5. N65a is similar to N65 but with all upper case lettering. Frame size varies a little.
- Note 6. On cover from Birmingham to HMS Good Hope, sunk at the battle of Coronel, c/o GPO London.
- Note 7. N60 and N61 are now considered to be Bermuda markings. Delete from the record.
- **Note 8.** Paq 23 is Hosking 3 fig 130. He thought it might have been used aboard ship, but Dovey & Morris consider it a London marking.
- Note 9. A variant of Fig C2, measuring 36 x 11.5 mm, is reported by Steve Pacetti for 1851

Some idea of the bewildering array of Maritime Mail cancellations used at London can be gathered from the proof copies that follow. I am obliged to Frank Schofield for letting me have access to them.



The number 2 stamp was withdrawn in 1952 and the remainder have been in use since that year.

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TPO & Seapost Society

The TPO & Seapost Society was founded in 1938 by a group of some 42 enthusiasts, and it has been going ever since - catering for all who are interested in worldwide Maritime (seapost/paquebot/naval) and TPOs (Travelling Post Office) material, whether as a main collection or as part of some other collecting field. The Society now has some 200 members, mainly from Great Britain, but with about one in five members being international, from many other countries around the world.

Our insignia is made up of a circle broken into three parts, consisting of: in the upper left quadrant the ships wheel representing the maritime; the lower quadrant is the railway wheel representing the land based and the upper right quadrant the compass card representing the world which the society covers with its diverse membership

The Society issues an award winning 32-page quarterly journal size $8\frac{1}{4} \times 11\frac{3}{4}$ inches (A4) in colour. Much of the Journal content is original research of a historic nature as well as news and interesting information on TPO and seapost matters.

Postal Auctions are held 4 times a year and contain some 475 lots each. The exchange of news, views and information between members is encouraged by means of meetings held periodically in regional centres as well as London.

The Library has nearly 200 books and they are available on loan to UK members. We provide a photocopy service for members as well. We also keep extended runs of relevant magazines which are available to members. Our Honorary Librarian can usually find answers to most queries that are asked.
